## ADVOCACY

Zonta Clubs throughout the world are planning how they will contribute to the Zonta Says NO to Violence Against Women Campaign throughout the 15 Days of Activism, 25 November to 10 December. We will spend some of our meeting time on 2 November doing the same.

The 16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence is a global campaign to raise awareness about violence against women and its impact on a woman's psychological, physical, social and spiritual wellbeing.

The 16 Days of Activism begins on 25 November on the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, and ends on 10 December which is

International Human Rights Day.

These two dates highlight that violence against women is human rights abuse. Human rights cannot be universal without human rights for women.

The aim to end violence against women is based on a belief in PRIMARY prevention – that is, whole of population initiatives that address the primary ('first' or underlying) drivers of violence.

Everyone can do something to contribute to achieving this aim.

Primary prevention includes awareness raising – within families, social and community groups, workplaces and government.

**ACSO Premier's Awards Lunch**


A number of club members attended the ACSO Premiers Awards Lunch on Sunday October 9<sup>th</sup>. Our club was awarded runner up in the Social Inclusion Section with our work at the Eastern Adelaide Domestic Violence Service; Nadia Baldassi-Winderlich our club nominee for Alan Sloan Young Citizen Community Service Prize took out that prize and Val Baldwin received a certificate acknowledging her great volunteer work in the Heide Taylor Community Service Award category .

**Gerry** has written the following on a project she would like to share with us:

**Ivy** is 9 and suffers from a rare and incurable disease called E B (Epidermolysis Bullosa). It is a cruel condition where Ivy needs to be wrapped in bandages because her skin flakes and peels off causing immense pain and distress. She also has one of the most severe cases of the disease because her condition is both external and internal. EB sufferers have the most fragile skin imaginable and they are often referred to as either **Cotton Wool Babies** or **Butterfly Children** as their skin is as delicate as butterfly wings!

Ivy's skin blisters extremely easily both internally and externally and she is fed through a gastric tube inserted into her stomach, which is nothing short of horrific for both the sufferer and her family. There is no cure and life expectancy is not great.

The wings I am trialling here have taken many hours of work and gluing what felt like millions of sequins to resemble butterfly wings. They are not finished yet and probably need at least another two days to complete..... But it has been a labour of love and hope for beautiful Ivy and her amazing family.
