As we prepare for the Hamburg Convention members will be asked for their advice about the papers to be presented as well as support for delegates to make decisions about voting.


Our club will have two delegates based on the number of club members.

AWARDS

Women of Achievement Ceremony

Thank you to all the members for your support by attending the ceremony on Wednesday night and for bringing guests.

It was a good crowd with over 80 guests.

The Hon Katrina Hildyard was able to attend and she enjoyed mixing with the awardees and other guests. She spoke at length to the two university scholarship winners who have been researching women's issues that are relevant to her portfolio.

Zonta Community Development Grant at the University South Australia

Leanne and Raema attended the selection panel for this Grant at the Uni.S.A. Magill campus on 20th April.

Ms Biannon Hoskin was selected by the panel. She is a 4th year Social Work student

undertaking an Honours degree. Her Honours thesis will be a critical analysis of how mothers with an intellectual disability are represented in the national child protection policies.

The study aims to understand what the problem within the policy is represented to be, while analysing what assumptions and biases mothers with an intellectual disability endure.

Briannon has overcome many adversities losing her parents and balancing volunteer work and 3 part time jobs to assist her grandparent's household where she resides with her younger brother.

This grant will enable her to replace her broken computer and purchase a program which she needs for her research.

Briannon had been concerned about how she could gain more employment hours to cover this cost.

The appointment of Briannon as the grant recipient occurred just in time for her to be invited to attend the Women of Achievement ceremony.

She was thrilled to be able to meet the Minister for Child Protection Hon. Katrine Hildyard due to her current thesis topic in this area and that one of her casual employment positions is in child protection support.

Young Women Leadership Course

Plans are progressing for this course which will commence on 12th and 13th May.

So far 11 girls have been selected at Adelaide High School and once school resumes Mitcham Girls High will provide the organisers with the names of the students.

The venue for all the session will be rotated at the two school campuses.
