Firstly, I'd like to congratulate the recently inducted new executive and directors. Considering the talents and skills you all hold, I know that our club is in safe hands

Below are few items that may interest the club considering changes in our practice at the EADVS.

The trial period of moving the Oz Harvest team to a Tuesday operation has been enormously successful with some of our prime reasons for the shift having a positive consequence in terms of supporting the core participants: Angela and Wendy.

Another of our main concerns was to be put to the test on Tuesday following the Queen's Birthday public holiday. Usually, a public holiday has a flow-on effect in reducing the food donations for distribution at the EADVS.

For example, there is no bread pick up from Bakers Delight by Beverley, so that is one of the privations we always experience on a Tuesday following a public holiday.

Unfortunately, the Tuesday (following the Queen's Birthday public holiday) the Oz Harvest driver was unwell so there were no deliveries at all. We were hoping that Oz Harvest will not be affected, but will have to wait until the next public holiday to be in a position make a judgement.

Another SEVICE COMMITTEE development is that in anticipation of a meeting with Kaye as incoming president. I was prompted to create a document combining details of both our historical and current protocols.

I interviewed Mary Burford shortly before she took leave of absence and compiled a detailed and comprehensive record of: roles, responsibilities and contacts in relation to our three key areas of responsibility:

The EADVS Birthing Kits Breast Cushions I will distribute this document to members of the Service Committee when Mary returns from leave and has had a chance to respond to the draft documents.

Angela has followed up my suggestion regarding using cellophane bags to package breast cushions in order to streamline the wrapping process. At this stage we have a quote for .55 cents per bag (45cm x 34 cm) from Baldocks wholesalers in Adelaide, but we will continue to see if this can be undercut by other suppliers.

Last Tuesday, Kendy from the EADVS offered to help us out by ordering the bags through their account to get a discount. This will be investigated over the next week or so.
