## Attempt to solve Men's Violence

A representative from the Men's Referral Service, Ms Stephanie Carter, spoke about men and domestic violence in the household, at the Zonta Club of Adelaide, in March.

The Men's Referral Service, a national public service dealing with a broad range of men's issues, started 30 years ago.

One of the valuable aspects of the service is a telephone line allowing men over 18, to ring in about their violence and abuse in relationships.

An Intervention Service also exists, which involves more than one telephone call with a man – something needed in some areas because there is no Men's Referral Service there.

More than 40 men telephone the service in South Australia each week, seeking some sort of help.

"Courts often say men need counseling, and we talk to men about some strategies we hope they can use to better the situations they are in," Ms Carter said.

However, men were at different stages of readiness to discuss their options, Ms Carter said.

Some men take on their new responsibility from an early stage in their counseling, while others do not, Ms Carter said.

Sometimes, it "requires Cognitive Behaviour Therapy," Ms Carter said.

Six sessions of counseling are being offered by the Men's Referral Service, based on gender and stereotypes.

The problem we find with "some men is that they tend to blame people outside themselves rather than make relevant choices," and not a lot of change occurs," Ms Carter said.

Many men who come in contact with the Men's Referral Service go there to receive help with working out their problems, and to find there are reasons for them to change.

"They are lost in their life, and people they care about are important, so it is important for him to change as well.

"It's important for that man to figure it out!" Ms Carter said.

She said that there was a service in Tasmania which allowed men to leave their home for 30 days to work on their problems.

# Film shows changes in Women's Movement

More than fifty people attended the film Brazen Hussies, at Mitcham Girls High School, on Sunday, 26 March.

The film was a fundraiser for the Zonta Club of Adelaide, and representatives of the National Women's Council and women from a range of Adelaide suburbs attended.

What the film highlighted was that during the 1960's and before that, women were not allowed to participate or had very limited rights in many areas of society.

For example, women were not allowed to drink in front bars of hotels, single mothers were not allowed to keep their children, women were not allowed to have legal abortions, women were not allowed to be employed in the Public Service, men believed women should be pregnant and barefoot in the kitchen, women experienced domestic violence and could not leave the marital home because they had no money, and when women did get jobs they were not given equal pay for an equal day's work.

Such issues, and other restraints on women, saw the rise of various women's groups and the increase in the size of the Women's Movement in Australia.

During the 1970's, Mr Gough Whitlam's Government was elected Federally, and that led to the appointment of a Women's Advisor to Prime Minister Whitlam.

The Women's Advisor helped bring change by making policy on women's rights, nationally communicating problems women faced, and by offering solutions to many of those problems.

While many advances in the area of Women's issues were made during the 1970's, public criticism saw the eventual downfall of the Women's Advisor.

The film clearly shows the stages that the women's movement took during the 1960's and 1970's and includes interviews with many women directly involved in the women's movement at that crucial time.

Brazen Hussies is an educational film which everyone should see.
