At the April Board meeting discussion focused on fundraising events, including funding and organisational documentation.

National Council of Womenupdate report

The April meeting of the National Council of Women SA had a broad agenda, but I have chosen to focus on one key aspect: advocacy work in the space of gender-equity as a key issue is being examined both in SA and nationally, but also as part of the NGO- UN focus for the month.

On Thursday 20th April 2023, I will be participating in a Round Table with The Minister for Women. Senator the Hon Katv Gallagher, the Minister for Social Services and Member for Kingston, Hon Amanda Rishworth MP, and Member for Boothby, Ms Louise Miller-Frost MP, on women and gender equality, to hear about priorities for the Government's new National Strategy to Achieve Gender Equality. "The Government has opened a survey to inform the National Strategy and is also holding targeted consultations to hear from people and organisations on what is needed to establish Australia as a world leader for gender equality." "Minister Gallagher, Minister Rishworth and Ms Miller-Frost MP want to hear your thoughts and reflections, based on your experiences and the experiences of your organisations.

A Discussion Paper has been publicly released to inform discussions about the National Strategy, and the roundtable will cover the issues and questions raised in this paper."

Stop the blame, says Minister

"Health, disability care, and ending homelessness are my passions," the Minister for Human Services, the Honorable, Natalie Cook, said in a speech to Zonta in April.

Services for marginalized people in South Australia are very important, and so are issues facing women.

And, while in Parliament, she noticed that "as a society, we should not be judged and blamed."

Ms Cook, a former Nurse trainee at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, grew up in a loving family and lived amongst other hardworking families who were "tipped over the edge if they happened to lose a job, or prices went up."

"My parents always said, 'take notice of Politicians,' " Ms Cook said.

Having lost her son in an unprovoked, one punch attack, Ms Cook said that having a home was very important.

"Without a home and without a shelter, one cannot access things like good healthcare, education, and self education," she said.

"I looked at the list of children from other countries in court this morning, and saw they were often underdeveloped, undernourished, under 14 years old, and with no direction in life.

"We have just got to do better.

"We need to stop blaming people, and ... produce a better society.

She said that in order to do that, we needed a community which is more caring, nurturing, equal, respectful, that sets goals and achieved them, and therefore got "more bang for their buck."

Some "good conversations involving women were being had with the right people," raising the bar in the areas of housing, health, education and the protection of women," but acceptance was still a problem.

Ms Cook said that the news cycle also was so short that Human Services could be headline news one minute but not the next minute, and social media was good for nothing more than telling someone they were doing a good job, (because of the trolling).

One area people wanted improved which has succeeded, was disability services, because of the

introduction of the NDIS (National Disability Insurance Scheme).

The NDIS is a "game changer," according to Ms Cook, and it serves up to 50,000 South Australians.

The State Government also has spent much money providing bathrooms for people with Autism.

Other programs the Government is focusing on include: Dementia, Aboriginals, children in public housing (who often also have bad health problems), generational poverty, a Home Equity Program for the Homeless, people who speak a second language, assertiveness training for young people, jailed children and how the court system can be improved, and those with limited communication skills.

This Government's identification of these problems, and focus on them has helped women who are carers and nurturers, and that's had a flow on effect to the general community.

Ms Cook said it would take five to ten years to address the Public Housing problem because much of the housing is up to 80 years old, and built of weak materials.

"Public Housing is hard work but we are not going to give up on it. I am very happy to be leading Human Services and social housing," Ms Cook said.
