The training of 10 students from Mitcham Girls Hiah School and 10 from Adelaide High School took place on 18th May at MGHS and 19th May at AHS. The girls were Year 10 students selected by the program teachers at each school Jill Olifent at MGHS and Leanne Davies at AHS. Leanne will be our guest speaker in July - she has an amazing story of successfully creating change in the culture of AHS, also an interesting personal story. Mireille Le Doledec, teacher at AHS also attended the course. Club members: Kaye, Kathy, Louise and I attended the training, sadly Margie was unable do so, due to catching covid. Raema and Maxine will take up a mentoring role.

Melanie Tate from the Leaders Institute SA was the facilitator of the training. She is also the CEO of nfp Puddle Jumpers that focuses on providing camps and other support for children and families where the children do not live with their birth parents.

Mel is a young, dynamic person with much experience in training young people and a deep commitment to community. All the mentors and teachers present were impressed with Mel's style, resources and empathy in making the young women feel safe and brave enough to participate fully in the program.

Service important – King Charles 111

On the 6 May, this year, the coronation of King Charles 111 of the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth took place in the biggest ceremonial event in the United Kingdom in 70 years.

Known for being a supporter of climate change, King Charles 111 will set a different tone to that of his mother, the late Queen Elizabeth 11.

King Charles 111 also plans "to serve, not be served."

As a service and advocacy organization which has dedicated itself to service, and women in climate change, the Zonta Club of Adelaide welcomes King Charles 111's interest in those issues.

The Coronation itself was lengthy and included many traditions and the pomp and ceremony one would expect of such an occasion.

The original focus of the day was on the ornate and gilded carriages which took King Charles 111 and Camilla, past thousands of well wishers on the road from Buckingham Palace to Westminster Abbey, where the coronation was held.

Andrew Lloyd Webber's music, a beautifully decorated Westminster Abbey, and the historical nature of the Coronation, presided over by Archbishop Justin Welby, gave the ceremony a great depth of meaning.

Two thousand invited guests from around the world were in attendance at the Coronation including Australia's Prime Minister, Mr Anthony Albanese, and his partner Jody Haydon, Prime Ministers of numerous nations, Diplomats and members of many Royal Families.

During the largely religious ceremony, King Charles 111 promised to be "true to his faith," that he be "the Defender of the Faith, the people, and respect other people of Faith."

Once King Charles 111 was crowned, his wife Camilla was crowned Queen Consort with a crown (previously owned by Queen Mary) that included the Cullinan diamond.

For those wanting to know about what the future might hold, should King Charles 111 pass away before the Queen Consort, Camilla will be Queen Dowager, not Queen because she is married to the King and not a Queen in her own right.
