As we move towards the end of the year we can reflect on our activities. One of the major successes this year has been a significant increase in membership. Eleven women have joined our membership this year including four who will join at the November meeting. We warmly welcome them and look forward to their contribution, both in activities and new ideas.

Our Christmas function to celebrate contributions of members during the year will be held on Saturday December 2nd at Stamps Restaurant in Mitcham. The whole restaurant has been booked for the event and we look forward to finishing the year with a party.

Raema has asked for volunteers to assist with the organisation of our Amelia Earhart breakfast to be held on January 21st at 9.30 in Botanic Park. If you can assist please let her know. The breakfast is an informal get together to begin the year. Friends and families are welcome.

A major fundraising event, an Open Garden, will be held on February 17 and 18^{th.} We will receive a percentage of the gate receipts and money we can raise from selling Devonshire tea and tickets for a raffle. There will be 3 two-hour shifts each day and we will need 5-6 people per shift, so it will be all hands on deck. Please let Gerry know as soon as possible times that would suit.

A reminder that contributions are sought for Christmas gift packs for the DV Centre as mentioned at our last meeting. Contributions can be brought to the November meeting.

The UN and Zonta International's 16 Days of Activism against Gender Based Violence begins on November 25 and continues until December 10. It is time to get out all things orange. The march in the city will be on the morning of 25th November.

I will report on the results of the Premier's Awards Luncheon at out meeting in November. Our speaker for that meeting is Mel Tate who runs the charity Puddle Jumpers and who has been leading the Young Women's Leadership Program this year.

The Open Garden Scheme has confirmed that our next Open Garden fixture will be over the weekend of February the 17th and 18th of February 2023. The location is High Street Burnside.

I am delighted that the Zonta Club of Adelaide has been included again and that our reputation of quality and competency is much valued by the organisers.

An extract from the email sent by Kate Chattaway and Virginia Sheridan:

We have been asked to manage the gate takings and the owners have generously chosen to donate half of the gate profits to Zonta.

The 50% gate takings offer means that we are guaranteed of a good return for this fund-raiser. However, it also has an impact on the number of volunteer helpers we will require.

This will be a bigger demand on members because with a total of **SIX** shifts with **TWO** people on the gate and **FOUR** required for the Devonshire Tea stall, there will be a demand for a total of **THIRTY-SIX helpers.**

I will be meeting up with the Breast Care Cushion Sewing group in early November so I'm anticipating that some of them will be able to help us with the gate.

Some points to take into account include:

- 1. The property is quite small when compared with Cooinda, and will attract fewer visitors.
- 2. The Devonshire Tea stall will have direct competition from a high-end café only 20 metres away. They will be selling real coffee.
- 3. We will need TWO EFTPOS machines to cover the two stations. I have left a message with Erica to consider how we will manage this.
- 4. The kitchen area is quite small and to access the area we will have to move through an occupied granny flat to reach it. I have a few concerns about this and need to consider this in our plans.

Apart from all of this I am very confident that this will be, yet again, a brilliant and enjoyable fundraiser.

- 1. Angela and several club members: Raema, Annette, Maxine and Trish have agreed to run a Birthing Kit
- 2. Assembly at Adelaide High School on Friday the 10th of November
- 3. **Breast care Cushion construction** will take place on the same day with the usual assistance from Ivanka, Mary Burford (Friend of Zonta) and Gerry.
 - The Breast Care Cushion Packing/ Delivery Day will follow at Ivanka's on Saturday the 11th of November. Please put the Packing Day in your diaries as we will require volunteers to assist. It only takes about four of us and the time commitment is about 2 hours. With an early start, 9.00am, we usually finish at 11.00am. Coffee/ cake and a chat always punctuate this delightful morning, 25 Church Street MAGILL.
- 4. I have submitted a brief Zonta Volunteers profile article which will appear in the Women's Safety Services Annual Report. The WSS forwarded this request to Alison Meneaud from the EADVS.
- 5. Most importantly, we are assembling Christmas hampers for the victims of domestic violence on Thursday the 7th of December at the EADVS.

The Zonta Club of Adelaide has always donated lovely items for this morale-boosting recognition of our sympathy and support for the victims who what it means to uproot their lives because of the fear of abuse.

I thank those members who have already donated gifts and encourage more of you to keep this wonderful tradition in mind. Gifts can be brought to the next club meeting on **November 1**st, OR, to the Christmas luncheon on **Saturday the 2**nd of **December**


A graphic on the SDG for Climate Change:










OUR WINDOW TO AVOID CLIMATE CATASTROPHE IS CLOSING RAPIDLY















RISING GLOBAL TEMPERATURES CONTINUE UNABATED, LEADING TO MORE EXTREME WEATHER
