SERVICE REPORT FOR THE CLUB JANUARY 2024

On the 7th of December we packed **161 Christmas hampers** for the victims of domestic violence at the EADVS. We have had many grateful comments from the clients themselves because the donations have been extremely generous from both the club members and the many friends and businesses who support us.



The Open Garden roster is detailed below Please consider it as a draft at this stage because I'll be running it past the volunteers to see if they want changes.

The Silent Sewers have now filled the gate roster so that removes a huge burden from our shoulders. The Open Garden Scheme will also be loaning us a second EFTPOS machine to use at the gate. Many, many thanks to Dymphna Sprod from the Silent Sewers and Virginia Sheridan from the Open Garden Scheme. I will be, again, inspecting the Burnside OG venue when I return from Perth after the 30th of January.

We have been the happy recipients of a huge donation of 50 - 60 breast care cushions via Sarah Cunningham, the Area 2 Breast Cushion coordinator. I have been in communication with Sarah since last year when she donated a generous quantity following the withdrawal of the Zonta Club of Noarlunga. We still need to gift wrap the cushions but we're very happy that this will give us a buffer when demands from the hospital peak as they have in the past.

I have mailed off a breast cushion to a woman in Perth who has had complications following breast surgery. I'm a bit surprised that Zonta clubs in Perth seem not to have a breast care cushion program. Perhaps they do but it's not widely known.

ADVOCACY COMMITTEE REPORT

Justice Responses to Sexual Violence

The Australian Law Reform Commission (ALRC) has been asked to inquire into justice responses to sexual violence in Australia. This Inquiry forms part of the Government's commitment to strengthen and harmonise sexual assault and consent laws, and to improve outcomes and experiences for victim-survivors in the justice system. This Inquiry will be informed by, and build on, the comprehensive inquiries and reviews previously undertaken in several Australian jurisdictions.

In August 2023, the Government hosted a <u>National Roundtable on Justice Responses to Sexual Vio-</u><u>lence</u> which brought together victim-survivors, representatives from the service and advocacy sectors, other experts, and Commonwealth, state and territory ministers. These discussions informed the <u>terms of ref</u><u>erence</u>. For many with experience and expertise in the area, the challenges highlighted were nothing new.

There has been a significant amount of time and energy poured into sexual violence law and policy reform in Australia since the 1970s, highlighting the <u>persistent barriers</u> faced by victim-survivors in seeking criminal justice responses to sexual violence and harm.

It is, therefore, pleasing to see the Australian Law Reform Commission finally listening. However, there is also a degree of community caution about what impact the reforms like this will realistically have, given previous attempts have been <u>routinely undermined in practice</u>.

Commission Status of Women (CSW)

Each year in March, the UN Agency, CSW holds a two week meeting in New York. The largest annual gathering of people committed to women's rights globally. The sessions over the fortnight are done in partnership with UN Women and is complemented by hundreds of workshops held by NGO CSW across the city. Zonta International, through their general consultative status to the UN, takes part in both the discussions and workshops. ZI also publishes a <u>CSW Statement (you need to log into ZI to see this link)</u>.

The priorities for 2024 – CSW68 are:

• **Priority theme**: Accelerating the achievement of gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls by addressing poverty and strengthening institutions and financing with a gender perspective.

• **Review theme**: Social protection systems, access to public services and sustainable infrastructure for gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls (agreed conclusions of the sixty-third session)..



While there was some quiet time over Christmas, I was able to prepare a 9 month reconciliation of our accounts against the budget and present that to the board at the January meeting. While we are tracking nicely much has been due to unexpected donations as fundraising events this financial year have been few. There are still two large outlays to come in the coming months for scholarships to Adelaide HS and Mitcham GHS. The Open Garden in February will help offset this outlay.

The Board has approved continued efforts to seek membership to National Federation of Australian Women (NFAW). If the application is approved the costs are minimal and the key benefit is to enable our larger donors (including corporates and individuals) to claim a tax deduction. This requires aligned values, a single focus project and planned and documented efforts to promote and seek donations. This will take some time.

A second initiative is also being investigated, that of activating our DONATE button on the club website. This will not provide tax deductibility but will provide another way for our supporters to make donations using their credit card and enable the club to recognize and thank donors. We will engage Fiona from DIY Digital to provide us with a quote to do the work. Donations during this financial year have been significant and as Zonta becomes better known in the community having an easy way to contribute is important.

I am happy to take questions on these initiatives at our February club meeting. If you would like to check out NFAW please look at their website.
