

From Year 12 winner at MGHS

My name is Amelie, and I was the year 12 recipient of the 2024 scholarship from Mitcham Girls High School. I greatly appreciate the consideration of my teachers in nominating me for this fund, as well as the Zonta Club of Adelaide for its continuing dedication to empowering, supporting, and uplifting women globally.

Since childhood, the performing arts have brought me immense joy, as well as opportunities for physical, social, and emotional development. Thus, after much consideration, I chose to use my scholarship as a payment towards a six-day dance trip to Melbourne. On this school trip, I was able to bond with fellow student, enhance my theoretical and practical knowledge across a variety of different dance genres, challenge myself and step outside of my comfort zone by learning from notable choreographers, and view seasoned professionals working in a variety of commercial and theatrical contexts. Participating in this inaugural trip provided me with knowledge I can apply into my study of Stage 2 SACE dance, and I have been very inspired by what I have seen over my stay. I firmly believe that learning does not have to be confined to the four walls of a classroom, and experiences such as this demonstrate that philosophy. Not only did I immerse myself in the broader Australian dance scene, but I was able to actively engage in my passion for geography, sociology, and urban design when exploring an unfamiliar city with my peers- something that aligns very closely with my future goals. This scholarship program is a wonderful opportunity for many young women like me to broaden their educational horizons, and I will treasure the experiences I have had as a recipient of this award.

YOUNG WOMEN LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

This year's course commenced on the 9th and 10th May with Melanie Tate employed by the Leaders Institute to deliver the course assisted by Bailee Phillips. 20 students from MGHS and AHS were active in all their training working groups. The students have now been allocated into 5 projects teams consisting of 4 students - 2 from MGHS and 2 from AHS.

This year's project topics are Modern Slavery (Mentor-Erica), Technology and Coercion with a focus on Multicultural Communities (Mentors - Sue and Raema), Thriving Families (Mentors- Heather and Raema), Menstrual Taboo(Mentor-Kaye) and Homeless and Youth (Mentor- Maxine).



The third full day occurred last Friday at Adelaide High School where the students learnt more skills and shared progress on their projects and assisted each other in ideas on how to further develop their projects.

Mel and I have been exploring ways to support the students beyond their formal training and to look at how the program gains feedback on their leadership journey. As a result and in discussion with the other Zonta Mentors, we have agree to look at forming a Zonta Young Leaders Alumni. This will start by inviting the current students and the 2023 graduates to an inaugural Alumni get together in October 2024. This will be promoted to the 2023 and 2024 Young Leaders via a Facebook Group page and we will explore a easy accessible venue to hold the first get together one afternoon outside school hours.

Zonta Community Development Grant Uni SA

After considerable deliberation by the Awards Panel and discussion and endorsement by the Awards Committee, it was decided not to award a 2024 scholarship. There was only one applicant and the standard of the application did not meet and address all our criteria.
